### UPCOMING EVENTS:

Traditionally, the *Solemnity of All Saints* is celebrated on 1 November, but in South Africa it is celebrated this year on Sunday 6 November.

Wednesday 2 November is *All Souls Day* - Holy Mass will be at 8am, 10am (Waysiders) and at 6pm. At the 6pm Mass, a *candle will be lit* by a family member in memory of each loved one who has died during the past year. Names can be given in at the parish office. If you wish to have your deceased loved ones remembered during the month of November, please fill in a *Pious List* and hand in at the parish office.

The *Waysiders* meet on Wednesday 2 November (All Souls) at 10am, at the altar of Our Lady of the Wayside (near the door leading to the Parish Centre). All Waysiders are invited to a discussion at 10am before Mass begins. After Mass, we will enjoy tea and refreshments in the hall, as is our tradition.

The Knights of Da Gama will be selling *Christmas Cards* from this weekend after all Masses.

The *Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion* meet on Wed 2 November (after the 6.00pm Mass (7.15pm) Bring the green & blue books handed out at the July meeting.

**LITURGY!** Parish preparation for the full implementation of the **new English translations** of the Sacred Liturgy: *Thursday 3, 10, 17, 24 November*: with DVDs, & discussion, 7pm, in the Parish Centre. ALL INVITED! This Thursday 3 Nov we will examine “living a Eucharistic life”.

### Reflection on the Eucharist (part 6)

Jesus exaggerates! A shocking allegation. We are to call no one our teacher nor our father! Terrible! We cannot call our own father ‘father’? Of course not. And our teachers cannot be called ‘teacher’? Woe to us if we read everything so literally. Holy Scripture is much more subtle than that. Thanks be to God! Jesus Christ is our true Teacher (our *rabbi*), and every teacher participates in his teacherhood. Therefore one of the most beautiful titles in the Church is that of Teacher (literally, *Doctor*), those who — always with the Holy Father — teach the teaching (*doctrina*) of the Church. We have 33 doctors, of whom the 4 great Latin Doctors are St Augustine, St Jerome, St Ambrose and St Gregory the Great. The four Great Doctors of the Eastern Church are St John Chrysostom, St Basil the Great, St Gregory Nazianzen, St Athanasius of Alexandria. The doctrine of the Eucharist is at the heart of the Christian people’s life. So important is this to us, that we dare not approach the table of the Lord without preparing our hearts and minds to receive Jesus. So, we open our Sunday missal to the very beginning (or another Catholic prayer book), and we pray the prayers of preparation quietly before Mass begins, e.g. the prayer of St Ambrose: “Lord Jesus Christ, I approach your banquet table in fear and trembling...”, or of St Thomas Aquinas: “Almighty, everlasting God, I draw near to the Sacrament of your only-begotten Son...”. After we have received the living God into our being, we rejoice in quiet thanksgiving after Communion, with the *Anima Christi* (“Soul of Christ, sanctify me, Body of Christ, save me...”), or St Thomas...
