Reflection on the Eucharist (part 4)

The difference between God and Caesar (the King / Emperor / Ruler / President / is always mysterious. Why would the Lord tell us to give anything to an earthly ruler, instead of to God alone? The old South African motto on coins was 'Soli Deo gloria': to God alone be the glory! But, although the Church may be divinely founded by her Lord and Bridegroom, she is made up of men and women who have human responsibilities to human rulers, whose kingdoms and republics are part of the earthly reflection of God's divine kingdom. In other words, Christians may be called "out of the world" to serve God in his holy Church, but they are also subjects of those who are the powerful - either divinely or humanly established. As such the Lord's "needs" earthly rulers to rule properly, and their subjects - us, the citizens - to be good citizens. It is the same with Christ, and the same with the Eucharist. Christ Jesus is the only person in all time, all of the universe, to unite humanity and divinity in himself. He is our only true King, to whom we owe total loyalty, and obedience, and love. And Jesus Christ has left us his Body and Blood. But our total devotion to Him, to the holy Eucharist, to Eucharistic Devotion, does not prevent us from being devoted citizens, neighbours, parents, children...This is how we live out a Eucharistic life : by taking the graces of God from the altar back into our homes, and our daily lives, full of thanksgiving and awe, and hope, and joy, and renewed faith.
