Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil....

In today's Gospel, with the light of faith, we should see in that possessed man every sinner who wants to be converted to God, every sinner who wants to free himself from Satan and from sin.

This message inspires, uplifts and challenges us and it becomes the basis for healing to those who are in need of wholeness.

Jesus not only inspired his audience, but also showed them deed that overthrew the power of sin and Satan. This is the foundation of restoration of God's law and order to all segments of human society. Through mortal sin many man become subject to the slavery of the devil. They separate themselves from the kingdom of God, only to enter the kingdom of darkness, of evil. We have to remain on the watch, so as to discern and reject the wiles of the tempter, who does not relax in his determination to harm us. He knows that as a result of original sin we have remained prone to evil, and vulnerable to our passions.

Mortal sin is the greatest misfortune that can befall a Christian. When he is moved by love, everything can be used for the glory of God and the service of his brother men, and earthly realities themselves are sanctified – homes, work, sport, politics... By contrast, when a Christian allows himself to be led astray by the devil, his sin brings into the world a principle of radical disorder which separated him for his Creator, and is, at bottom, the cause of all the horrors that afflict mankind.

Let us ask God for that purity of conscience which will lead us to abominate any offence against His sovereign goodness and never to make such an offence appear acceptable.
