Appearance of Our Lord to Mary Magdalene – Jesus in our lives

Mary Magdalene has returned to the tomb. Her affection and devotion for Jesus even after His death are deeply moving. She remains outside the tomb weeping – *I do not know where they have laid Him*. It is the only thing that matters to her in the whole world. Jesus said to her **Mary!** The word had that unique inflection which Jesus gives to every name – ours too – and which goes hand in hand with a vocation, with a very special friendship. Jesus calls us by our name - what a difference it makes to our existence, when we seek to live in accordance with this consoling reality : Jesus Christ continues to live among us! **Christ is alive.** He is not someone who has gone, someone who existed for a time and then passed on, leaving us a wonderful example and a great memory. His resurrection shows us that God does not abandon His own. He promised He would not. He is very close to each one of us. May external circumstances – tears, because of sorrow, failure, deception, pain or discouragement, never prevent us from seeing the Jesus who calls us. May we always be able to purify anything that could be the cause of our vision becoming clouded. The example of Mary Magdalene, who persevered in fidelity to our Lord in moments of difficulty, teaches us that whoever sincerely and constantly seeks Jesus will end up finding Him. In any circumstances whatever of our lives, we will find Him much more easily if we start out on our search led by the hand of Our Lady, our Mother, to whom we say : **Show unto us the blessed fruit of thy womb, Jesus**
