Committed to Family Rights as well as Responsibilities:

Rights always go along with responsibilities. It is not always easy to stand up for rights and commit to the responsibilities. The Church's Charter of Family Rights promotes the right to life, to marry, to have children, to work, to shelter and more. Providing these cannot be left to governments but includes a commitment from us as families too. We strive to have these rights recognized, but commit to live according to them. The family is much more than a mere legal, social and economic unit, but is a community of love and solidarity. It is uniquely suited to teach and transmit cultural, ethical, social, spiritual and religious values, essential for the development and well-being of its own members and of society.

Many spiritual authors have compared the soul to a shuttered and closed room. As the window is opened and light comes flooding in, its imperfections, its disorder and dirt, everything shabby and broken becomes visible. With the help of grace, we get to know the state we are in before God's eyes. The saints have always recognized themselves as sinners; by their correspondence with grace they have opened wide the windows of their soul to the light of God. In the examination we will discover also our omissions in the fulfillment of our promise of love for God and for men; and we will ask ourselves : to what can I attribute all this neglect and carelessness? Human life is in some way a constant returning to our Father's house. We return through conversion of heart which means a desire to change. It means a firm decision to improve our lives, a decision which is to be expressed in sacrifice and self-giving.
