Calmness in the Face of Difficulties

The Apostles, while sailing to the opposite shore as the Lord had told them, were twice caught by a storm on the lake of Gennasareth. Jesus was with them in the boat. He used the time to rest after a hard day's preaching. He lay down in the stern – He who governs the universe is stretched out there exhausted! Meanwhile His disciples, many of them sailors, begin to feel the first squalls of the gathering storm. It soon falls on them, with tremendous force *and the waves beat into the boat, so that the boat was already filling.* They did what they could, but the seas grew higher and rougher. Then as a last resort they turn to Jesus. They wake Him with a cry of distress : *Teacher, do you not care if we perish?* The skill of those sea-hardened fishermen was not enough. Our Lord had to intervene. *And He awoke and rebuked the wind, and said to the sea, 'Peace! Be Still!' And the wind ceased and there was a great calm.* Peace entered the hearts of those frightened men. Sometimes the storm arises around us or within us. And it seems that our frail craft cannot take any more. At times we have the impression that God is heedless of our fate. The waves are breaking over us : personal weaknesses, professional or financial difficulties that are beyond our management. But if you live in the presence of God, high above the deafening storm, the sun will always be shining on you; and deep below the roaring and destructive waves, peace and calm will reign in your soul. God will never abandon us. We must go to Him, using all the means we need to employ 'Lord, do not leave me!' And together with Him we will face up to those trials and surmount them
