Authority in the Church is a great blessing:

We should look upon authority in the Church with eyes of faith. Christ Himself comes to meet us in the instructions we are given by ecclesiastical authorities. The great enemy of authority and community is self-love. We have to be humble. A proud person will seek any excuse to avoid obedience.

Following Jesus' teaching, St Peter wrote to the Bishops that they were not to dominate people, but instead to serve by example. This truth is reflected in the title which has long been reserved for our Popes 'Servus servorum Dei' the servant of the servants of God.

The Eucharist reveals Our Lord by way of a Suffering Servant who teaches His sisters and brothers the art of serving. 'My body...for you...My blood for you and for all'. For Jesus, the idea of being servant to all involved a renunciation of status and rights. He showed us that we are truly remembered only when we forget ourselves for others.

Let us pray that the Church will always be blessed with good shepherds who know to serve all, especially those in greatest need.

Let us conclude by going to the protection of Our Holy Mother. She was the one who wanted to be the 'Handmaid of the Lord'. She will teach us the full meaning of that glorious Christian motto 'to serve is to reign'.
